## **Mission Statement**

The objectives of the Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Studio Art are to provide students with the intellectual and technical skills needed to successfully pursue a career as a professional studio artist and prepare them for potentially pursuing a graduate degree in Studio Art. Program goals are to provide a broad base of fundamental studio experiences at the foundation level, as well as, a firm grasp of historical and contemporary trends in the visual arts. Emphasis shifts to a concentrated focus in one or two areas of studio media during the junior and senior years, and to the development of personal content and direction. The BFA Studio Capstone Exhibition, which requires the creation of a conceptually cohesive body of artwork, is considered the culminating event in preparing our students for a career in the studio arts.

- Resumé

# 3. Within what context will the work be produced?

- Primarily during the senior year
- In conjunction with the senior capstone course and other studio art classes
- Under the supervision of chosen faculty mentor(s)

### 4. When in the program will students participate in the assessment?

- Spring semester prior to the final year before graduation (Preliminary review for BFA Studio Art Capstone Exhibition by team of 3 Art Dept. Studio Faculty)
- Prior to BFA Studio Art Capstone Exhibition (Some students undergo secondary review with same procedure as above)
- At the time of the BFA Studio Art Capstone Exhibition (Formal evaluation conducted by team of 3 Art Dept. Studio Faculty)
- End of final semester
   (By outside juror/evaluator)

### 5. How will students be selected for participation in this assessment?

• All senior BFA Studio Art students will be included in the assessment process

#### 6. How will the work be evaluated?

- Students will be evaluated by studio faculty teams based on the learning outcomes rubric (attached), as well as, other written comments
- Students will be evaluated by outside juror/assessor based on the learning outcomes rubric (attached), as well as, other written comments

## 7. Who will be evaluating the work?

An external assessor from a peer institution.

#### 8. What Data will be provided as a result of the assessment?

- Our external assessor will select works to be included in the Annual OSU Art Department Juried Student Exhibition and will write a statement that will be published in connection with the exhibit. He/she will also select awards in Studio Art.
- Our external assessor will have access to digital documentation of work exhibited in the BFA
   Studio Art Capstone Exhibitions as well as Artists statements written for the exhibitions. He/she
   will provide an overall written summary of his/her assessment of the program based upon the
   learning outcomes rubric (attached) and other relative professional insights related to the
   desired learning outcomes for the Studio Art Program.
- Studio faculty teams will compile data based on the learning outcomes rubric (attached)
