How were students selected to participate in the assessment of this outcome?: BFA Students who

What do the findings suggest about student achievement of this learning outcome?: It was noted that the external evaluation was consistent with the internal faculty evaluation with a 0.4 higher average ranking for this learning outcome by the external assessor. There was an increase of 0.3 over last year for the external evaluation and a decrease of 0.1 for the internal evaluation. The studio faculty views this as an indication that our program is achieving its goals in this area with a high degree of consistency.

Use of Findings (Actions): Based on these results we see no need for changes in our program curriculum concerning this particular learning outcome. This was the third year that Dropbox was used as the means of collecting electronic images for the external assessor's consideration. All twelve graduates supplied this information, which is an improvement over previous years. (07/23/2020)

Submitted works of BFA studio majors from all levels will be evaluated by the outside assessor for inclusion in the Annual Juried Student Exhibition. Some works will be selected for awards. Serving as juror for this exhibition affords the outside assessor an opportunity to view a comprehensive representation of the artwork being produced within our program. Observations gleaned from this experience are to be included in the written overview section of the assessor's report.

The Studio BFA Capstone Exhibition, Formal Assessment occurs at the time of the student's capstone exhibition, typically a few weeks prior to graduation.

The Studio BFA Candidate External Assessor Evaluations occurs during the final weeks of the academic year in which the student graduates.

The Annual Juried Student Exhibition occurs during the final weeks of the academic year.
